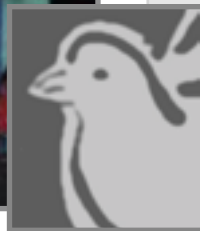
Christine Eber,

With over 25 years working in a Mayan community of Highland Chiapas, Christine Eber brings knowledge, compassion and reciprocity to her current project, the life story of a Mayan woman, "Antonia".

We will hear of the weaving cooperative Antonia helped found and what it has meant to the lives of the women and their sense of their own self worth. And how Christine has organized The Las Cruces/Chiapas Connection in order to sell the women's weavings in the US at a fair price, with all of the money going back to the women.



We will learn how all of this relates to the women's participation in movements of resistance to bring dignity and a measure of political, cultural and economic autonomy to their communities through the Zapatista Movement, the Word of God Movement (Catholic liberation theology) and the Catholic social justice organization, Las Abejas.
